You will cover units such as:

- Computer system component basics
- Diagnosis
- Health and safety
- Assembling, dismantling, installing and maintaining a desktop system
- Networking
- Computer security

This course can help you to progress into a wide range of ICT roles, including:

- Systems support desk technician
- Database administrator
- IT product developer

You will be assessed throughout the academic year through practical assignments and achieve the following qualifications:
